This year we are proudly hosting My Summer Adventure and invite readers of all ages to help us read books to unlock 50 trees to be planted in our award-winning parks. To date, our summer reading program has unlocked 100 trees that are now standing tall across our parks!

The concept of a summer reading program dates back to 1895 when children's librarian, Linda Eastman of the Cleveland Public Library, created a summer reading club for kids, and we are carrying on and building upon her idea 131 years later. We know that healthy reading habits are important for people of all ages, and with over half a million digital and physical titles to choose from, there's something for everyone at the Burlington Public Library!

This summer is a perfect time to use the library's resources to reflect on our nation's history as we celebrate 250 years since the signing of the Declaration of Independence. 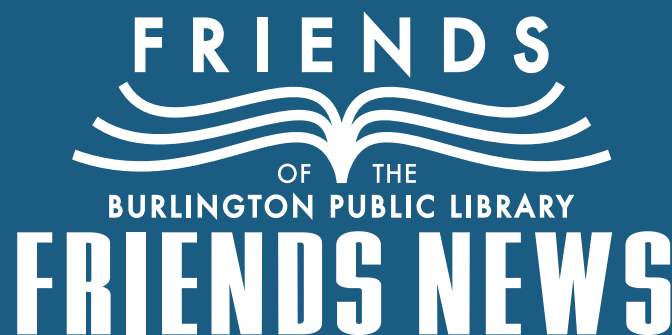
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FRIENDS OF THE BURLINGTON PUBLIC LIBRARY FRIENDS NEWS
