Happy Holidays to all & cheers to another great year at the Burlington Public Library!


Happy Holidays! There are so many great times to celebrate this season. If any of your celebrations include gift-giving opportunities, please think about shopping at the Footnotes store in the library.

# FIRST FRIDAY: UKRAINIAN HOLIDAY TRADITIONS

#### Friday, December 5 || 10 AM

Local Ukrainian, Iryna Brueck and others will share their most treasured holiday traditions; Christmas Eve: Families gather for a 12-dish dinner, beginning with the blessing of the kutya, a grain dish symbolizing ancestors and good fortune. Didukh: A decorated sheaf of wheat is the main house decoration, representing the family's ancestors. Vertep: A portable puppet theatre that reenacts the Nativity story. St. Nicholas Day (December 6th/5th): Children receive gifts from St. Nicholas before Christmas, often under their pillows. Malanka (January 13th): A New Year's Eve celebration with masquerades, folk performances, and ritualistic activities to ward off evil spirits.
