Strategic Planning

The public survey for our latest strategic plan closed on this month with a total of 152 patrons patricipating. Of those who participated, this is how they identified using our space (participants could choose more than one option):

83% - Check out materials

58% - Attend events

41% - Read in the library

39% - Use technology

37% - Connect to WiFi

36% - Meet with other people

31% - Remotely (Libby, Hoopla, etc.)

18% - Technology Help

>1% - Other (Volunteer, Study Rooms, Buy Books)

These survey results, along with staff, and Trustee input will help guide the 2024-2028 strategic plan, with a focus on the four areas of efficiency, sustainability, human-centeredness, and access.
