

- Help is always needed in the Footnotes Book Store. The store is open from 10-4 Monday through Saturday, with shifts running 10-1 and 1-4. It is an opportunity to help others find books they are interested in, to be around like-minded people, to help our organization, and sometimes to get some reading done when the store isn't busy! If you are interested in working in Footnotes, please contact Anita Wagner at 319-671-1512. You will need to fill out a volunteer form and submit to a simple background check.
- Help is always needed at the Book Sales held throughout the year. We need people to help set up, to help customers during the sale, to accept money, and to help clean up when the sale is over. There is a sign-up sheet in Footnotes at least two weeks prior to an upcoming sale which allows you to sign up for the activity you are interested in and the time(s) you are available. If you are interested in working at a Book Sale, please contact Cindy Murphy at 319-759-4855. You will need to fill out a volunteer form and submit to a simple background check.
- Help is sometimes needed in the actual Book Distribution area. Jobs included could be starting the processing of books, sorting books into the appropriate quality, categorizing the genre of the book, boxing up books, moving boxes of books around, and even picking books up from exterior locations. BEYOND THE BOOK CLUB


