

FRIENDS NEWS



Grant's presidency was filled with political drama, scandal and corruption, yet Grant dealt with weighty issues of Lincoln's assassination, Reconstruction and reconciliation of Southern states, the possible annexation of Santo Domingo, Native American land issues, a possible war with Great Britain, and Civil Rights. The action of the play takes place in the White House, late at night, during his final days in office, December 1876. As he reflects upon and reviews the final draft of his "Annual Message to Congress"

GALE GENERAL ONEFILE


