If a picture is worth a thousand words, I'd have to write an anthology on par with great literary masters to capture the wonder and joy of our new wheat paste mural. Featuring photos from the BPL archive as well as the Hawk Eye's archive, Ottumwa artist Isaac Campbell pieced together a collage that showcases the rich history of our beloved community library.

Although wheat pasting was once an illegal form of street art, we are using it to tell our story in a visually appealing and unique way. By mixing together flour, sugar and water, about 30 volunteers helped to soak our east facing retaining wall with this mixture and paste up massive 25 foot sheets of paper. The result is a temporary masterpiece that has captivated the community, and significantly slowed down traffic on our driveway! Isaac tells me that, "traffic problems are the sincerest form of street art flattery."

In digging through our archive stories of the library's history have come up, and with over 100 year's of operation, there are many stories to be shared! Photos showcasing the library staff highlight the heartbeat of our organization and speak to the passion that this place inspires. Today we benefit from the vision of those who fought and forged new waters for us to be able to operate in our stunning 210 Court St. location. The center of our mural features previous Director Kay Weiss during the groundbreaking ceremony for our current building. This is my favorite piece of this artwork as Kay's photo is beaming at our current entrance - the library that she, the Trustees and community members envisioned and persevered towards.


