Censorship is so 1984. Read for your rights.

Every fall the American Library Association leads libraries across the country in taking a week to recognize our right to read, and to read freely without fear of recourse or attack, through Banned Books Week. This right is guaranteed to us by the First Amendment and is something we ought to be very proud of, as the ability to freely access information is the cornerstone of a free and democratic society. This year the American Library Association (led by Burlington's own, Sam Helmick) is giving an Orwellias pin on Banned Books Week, highlighting George Orwell's classic 1984 which gives us a glimpse into the dangers of a censored society.

While banning books is certainly a hot topic nationally and here in lowa, we at the Burlington Public Library are taking this year's Banned Books Week to launch our very own Banned Camp Book Club. Led by the intrepid Burlington Public Library Board of Trustees, this book club will offer participants the opportunity to learn about why books are challenged and how the Burlington Public Library champions our right to read. By giving people a safe space to explore challenging themes and how the library responds to them, this book club will foster healthy civic dialogue and showcase how the Burlington Public Library works hard to ensure that everyone can see themselves reflected on our library shelves.

I encourage you to exercise your right to read and pick up a banned book to read and join the conversation at the Banned Camp Book Club. From the Bible to Charlotte's Web, there's a banned book for everyone and as the great library pioneer, S.R. Ranganathan is quoted, "every person has his or her book, and every book has its reader." Read freely this month & we'll see you at the library!


