FRIENDS NEWS

Welcome to 2026 - a year full of incredible milestones, exciting events, and endless possibilities! This year marks our semiquincentennial (250 years) since signing the Declaration of Independence. For better or for worse, our civilian-led democracy has certainly given us something to talk about, and I encourage you to take the next year to learn as much as you can from as many viewpoints as possible on our country's history. From biographies to historical fiction, our collection of over 100,000 items has something in it for you to travel back in time and explore the past 250 years here in America.

The Burlington Public Library was 1 of 50 libraries chosen nationally to host the U.S. Holocaust Memorial Museum's traveling exhibit, Americans and the Holocaust, and this summer the exhibit will make its way to Burlington. This six-week exhibit will open on August 19th and will be housed in the East wing of the library. We are incredibly honored to have been selected to house this exhibit and provide an opportunity for our community to examine the motives, pressures and fears that shaped Americans' responses to Nazism, war and genocide in Europe during the 1930s and 1940s.

2026 also marks the 20th anniversary of this incredible library building opening. In the fall of 2006 community members loaded up wagons and helped carry down the collection, artwork, office supplies, and furniture from our Crapo-funded building on Columbia Street to this 55,000 square foot facility on Court St. This new building opened up the next chapter of library services for the greater Burlington area, allowing BPL to host a larger collection, more programs, dedicated meeting rooms, two archives, and ample workspace for the staff. Later this year in November we will celebrate our anniversary and all that this building has allowed us to accomplish since the move.

While we have several big moments to look forward to this year, there are countless opportunities to feed your curiosity, meet new people, and help shape our thriving community by joining a library program, checking out our rich collection of resources, and gathering in our stunning 'new' library. Happy reading this year, and happy 2026!


The book sale will be Friday, January 23 for paid Friends members, Saturday, January 24 for the general public, and Monday, January 26 for a clearance bag sale.
