The library joined the city's phone system with new phones after over 15 years on a dated system that was beginning to fail.

Brittany presented to the Delta Kappa Gamma group about summer reading and the library's sensory accessibility initiative.

This interview focused on the inclusivity initiative here at BPL and came about in response to the Hawkeye article on the same subject that came out in April.

After much work by Lois, we received some of our ECF funding.

A team of staff members used the RFID reader wand that we are testing to scan the entire collection. They found any items that were not checked in, marked as lost, or had other issues.

May was focused on preparations for summer reading. At the customer service desk, we looked at where staff are located to be of the most help to our patrons. The library's traffic flow has improved since last year and we now have both sides of the customer service desk open. We have left the youth services desk to the bears and brought the summer reading desk back over to the west side of the customer service desk. This allows staff to flex where the patrons assistance is needed the most at any given moment, either signing families up for the summer reading program or helping them checkout materials.

Also in preparation for summer reading we have repurposed the signs at the front of the library to highlight programs and activities for separate age groups. These slat wall dividers are a great way to advertise upcoming events and prominently display them for patrons coming and going from the library.


