LIBRARY SERVICES

InterLibrary Loan

One of the great ways in which libraries across the globe have partnered is through inter library loan (ILL). This ingenious program allows for libraries to share collections, and move resources creating access to an incredible array of information. In Iowa, ILL is heavily subsidized with federal dollars through the State Library of Iowa and the Institute of Museum and Library Services. During Fiscal Year 2025 (July 1, 2024 - June 30, 2025) Burlington residents received 745 titles brought in through ILL, and in turn we sent out 1,064 of our own titles to outside organizations.

FEMA Cooling Center

With temperatures reaching dangerously high levels in June, the Burlington Public Library was utilized as a FEMA cooling center for anyone in the area needing to stay cool. This is a great example of how libraries are books and so much more. The physical space of public libraries serves as one of the greatest resources available to all. With renewable energy helping to run our HVAC system, we are striving towards an environmentally sustainable facility that serves the public and creates a space where people feel welcome to explore, learn, connect, and relax.

Community Outreach

In partnership with the City's Human Rights Commission, the Burlington Public Library was present at the annual Juneteenth and Pride events that took place this month.

The Burlington Public Library has staff liaisons to several organizations including: NAACP, Kiwanis, Altrusa, Des Moines County Genealogical Society, Iowa State Historical Society Foundation, Downtown Partners Inc., AFSCME 828, Governor's STEM Council, American Library Association, Iowa Library Association, and the Iowa Library Association Foundation.

In addition to the STEM fun sprinkled throughout the year, the library also utilizes previous awards from the STEM Scale-Up Program in their summer offerings.

Every Wednesday, weather depending, "H2O Yeah!" uses the WaterWorks program to help kids explore water—including fun with pouring, measuring, bubbles, and more. The library also uses Hummingbird Finch Robots to hold a "Robot Rodeo" in July, and they help kids explore computer coding without a computer through the Turing Tumble program.

Besides the use of STEM Scale-Up Program resources, visitors to the library can also check out the progress of the mural in the Teen Space, a part of the Smithsonian's Democracy in Dialog Virtual
