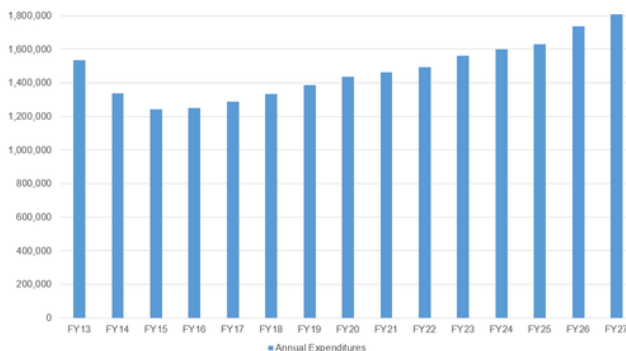

FY27 Budget

On January 21st the City held an all-day budget meeting where each department head presented their fiscal year 2027 (FY27) budgets to the City Council. Library Director, Brittany Jacobs, presented a FY27 budget request of **\$1,807,772** to cover staff, the building, and collections. For our current fiscal year (FY26) we are operating with a \$75,000 cut and had to reduce staff from 27 to 26, which is down 10 people from being fully staffed at 36. With 119,000 visitors to the library in fiscal year 2025 (FY25) that equates to **1 library staff for every 7,437 library visitors, and only 1 full-time staff for every 13,000 visitors.**



A large focus of this year's budget presentation was on the role that our public library plays in public safety. **Third and fourth grade reading proficiency remains a major predictor of long-term success or future imprisonment.** Low literacy is often seen as a key driver of, rather than just a correlation to, crime, as poor reading skills limit educational attainment and employment opportunities.

The Department of Justice has reported that, "the link between academic failure and delinquency, violence, and crime is welded to reading failure." **Two-thirds of students who cannot read proficiently by the end of fourth grade will eventually end up in jail or on welfare** (National Assessment of Adult Literacy).

Investing in the Burlington Public Library is a direct investment in the health of our community. Our requested \$1.8 million is but a small fraction of the total general fund, but is multiplied exponentially in the value added to our residents.

Series Labels

Lindsey and Carmen from our Tech Services Department have taken on the tasks of labeling all book series to coordinate each book with the order in which it falls in the series. We have heard from many patrons that this additional spine label has helped them easily identify and locate the books they are searching for.



This project is a great example of how identifying ways in which patrons navigate our space helps to inform how we can best provide and present information. Information seeking behavior, or the ways in which people look for information, is at the forefront of how we are managing our collections and the physical building. Many thanks to Lindsey and Carmen for their work on creating a more accessible and user-friendly collection.

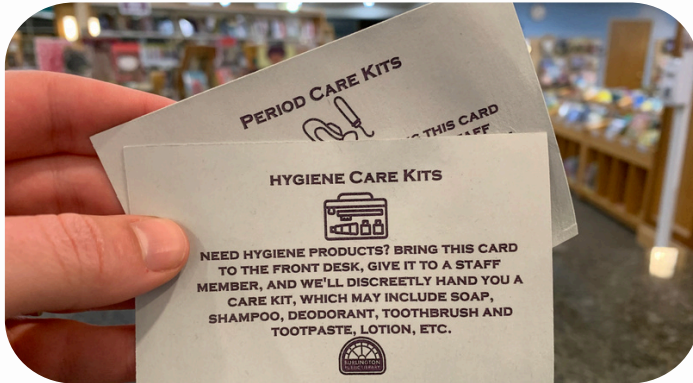
Babies Need Books

In 2025 the Burlington Public Library gave every new baby born at the Southeast Iowa Regional Medical Center a new book to welcome them into our community. Research indicates that literacy practices should begin as soon as a baby is born, if not before then, and to help support our area families we are happy to start them on their literacy journey with a new book.

Thanks to funding provided by the Murray Foundation and private donations we gifted 635 new babies with their very own book in 2025 - bringing the total amount of books given since 2013 to 6,127!

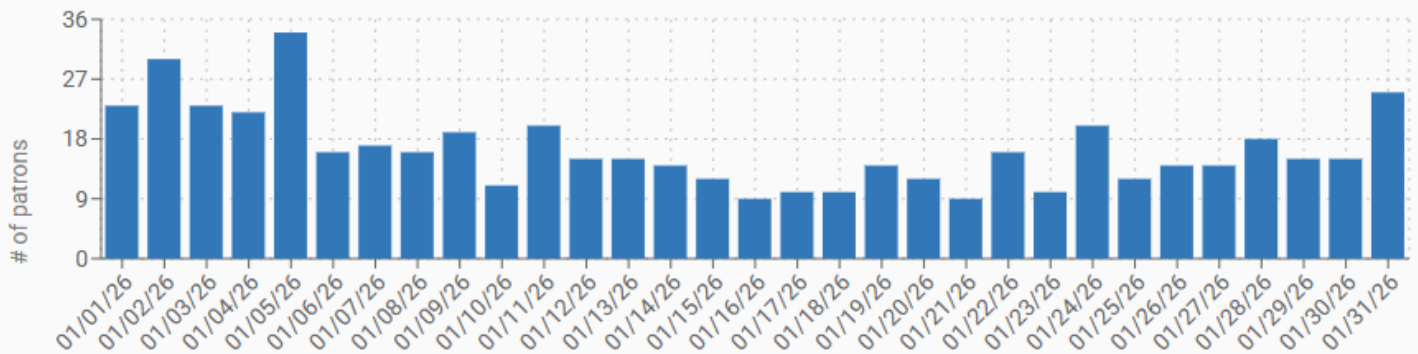

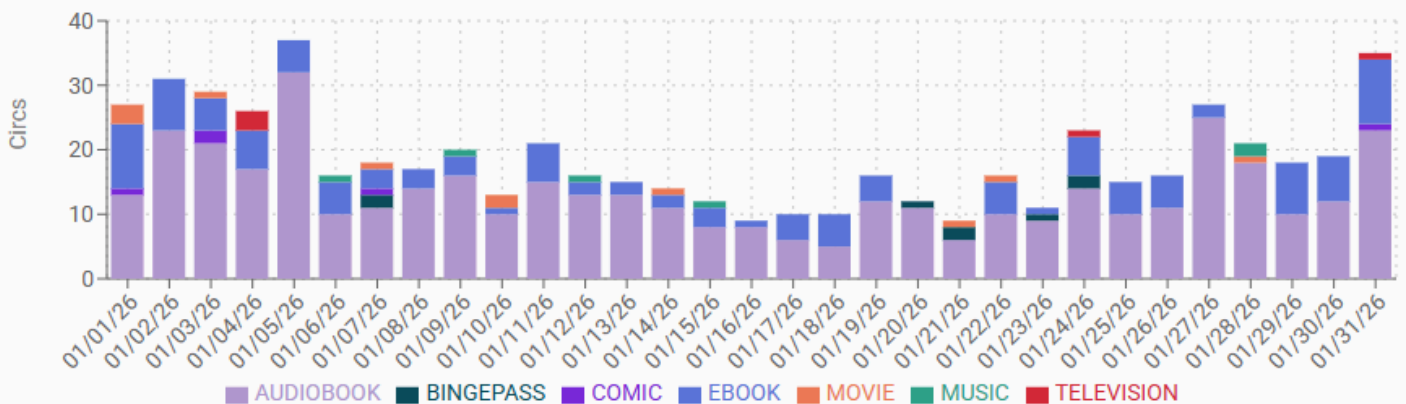

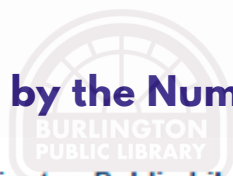

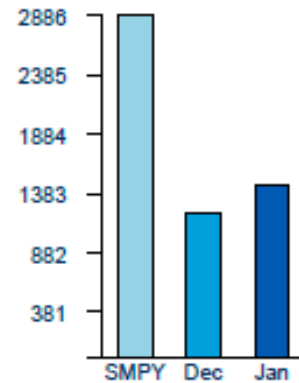

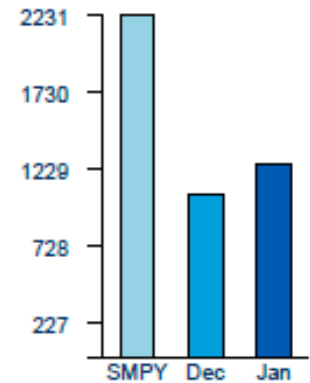

Total Monthly Session Count

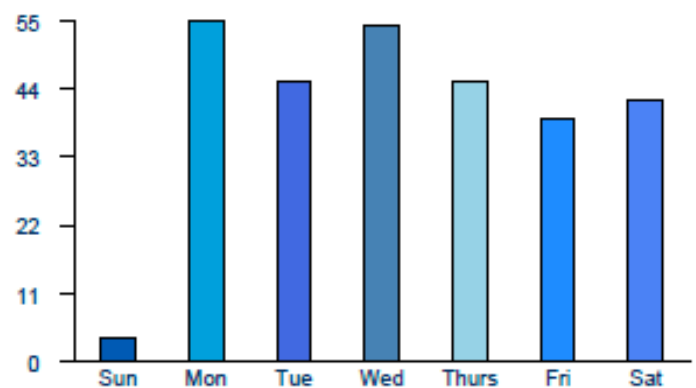


Total Monthly Visits
