Storytime with BFD

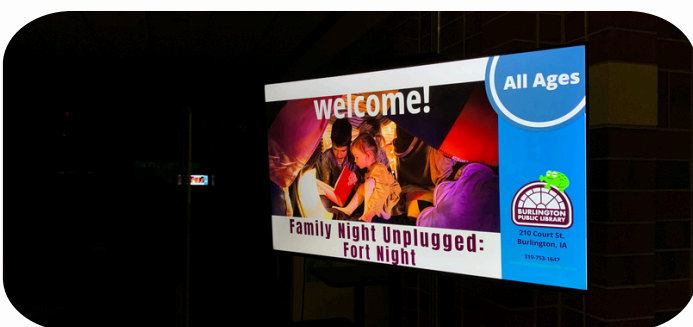

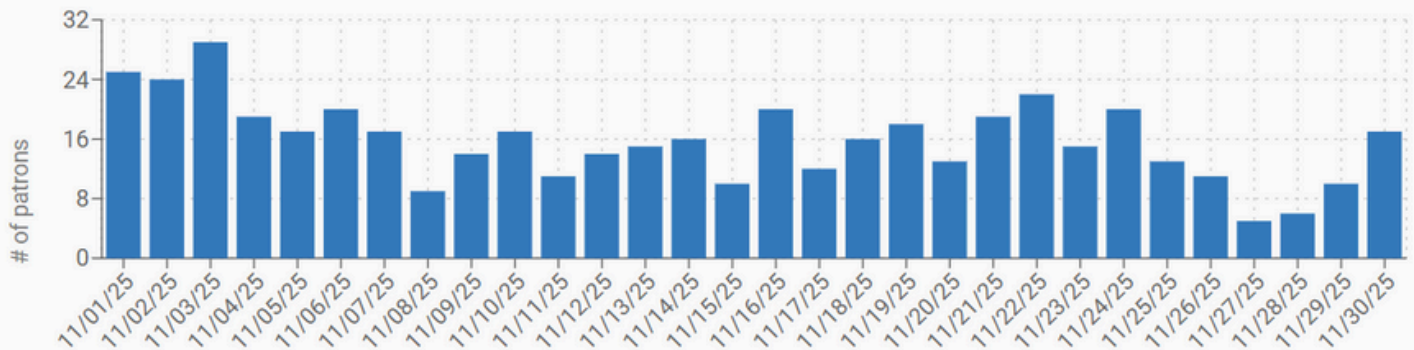

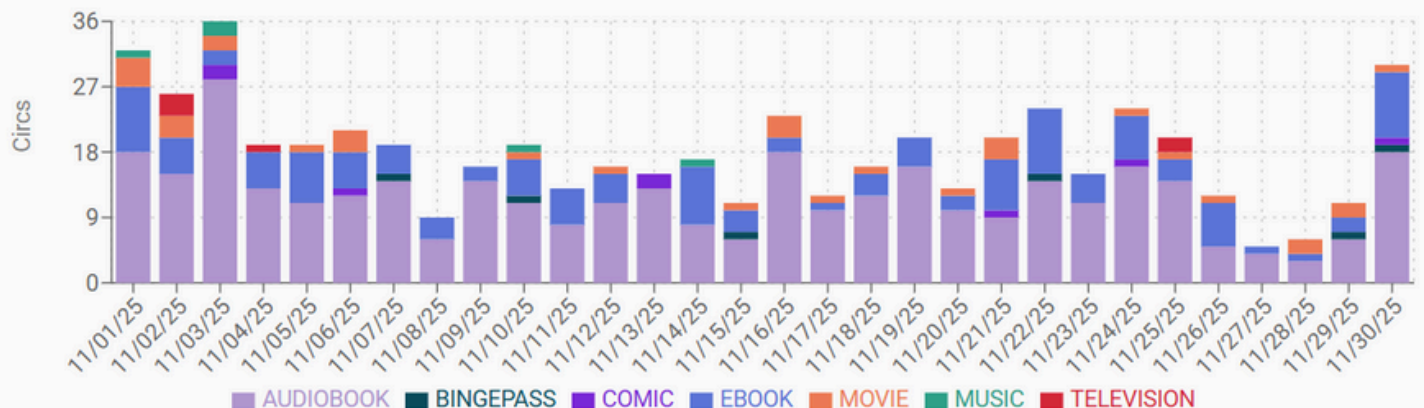

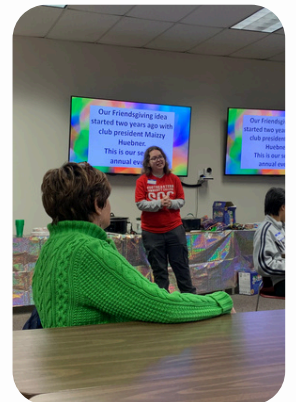

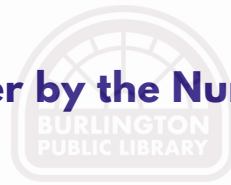

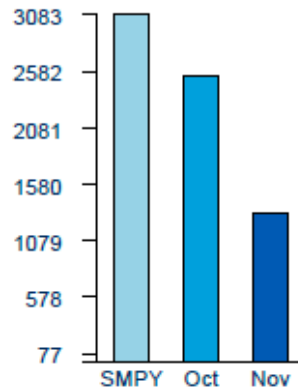

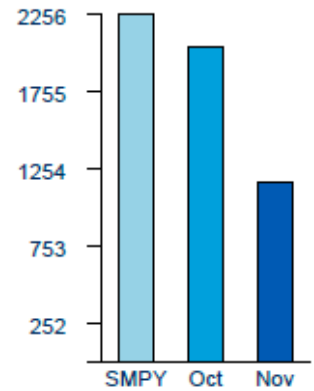

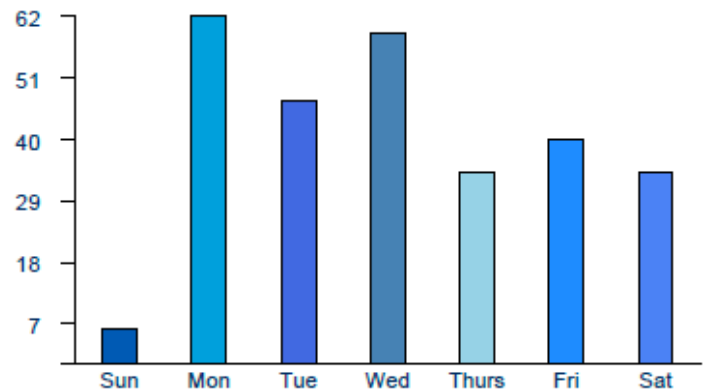

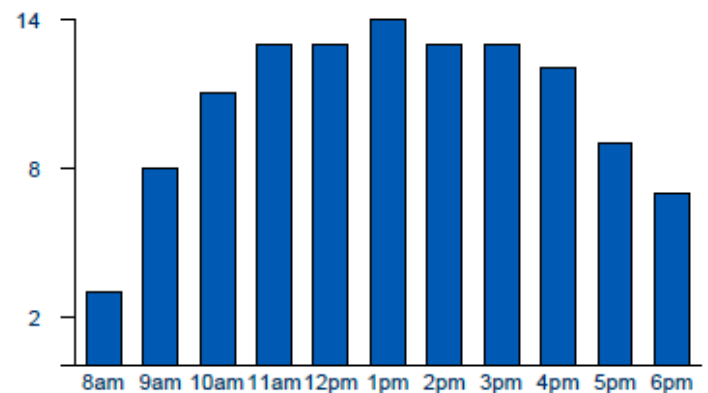

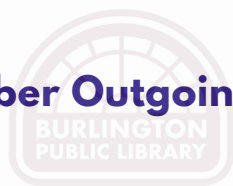
Average Daily Visits



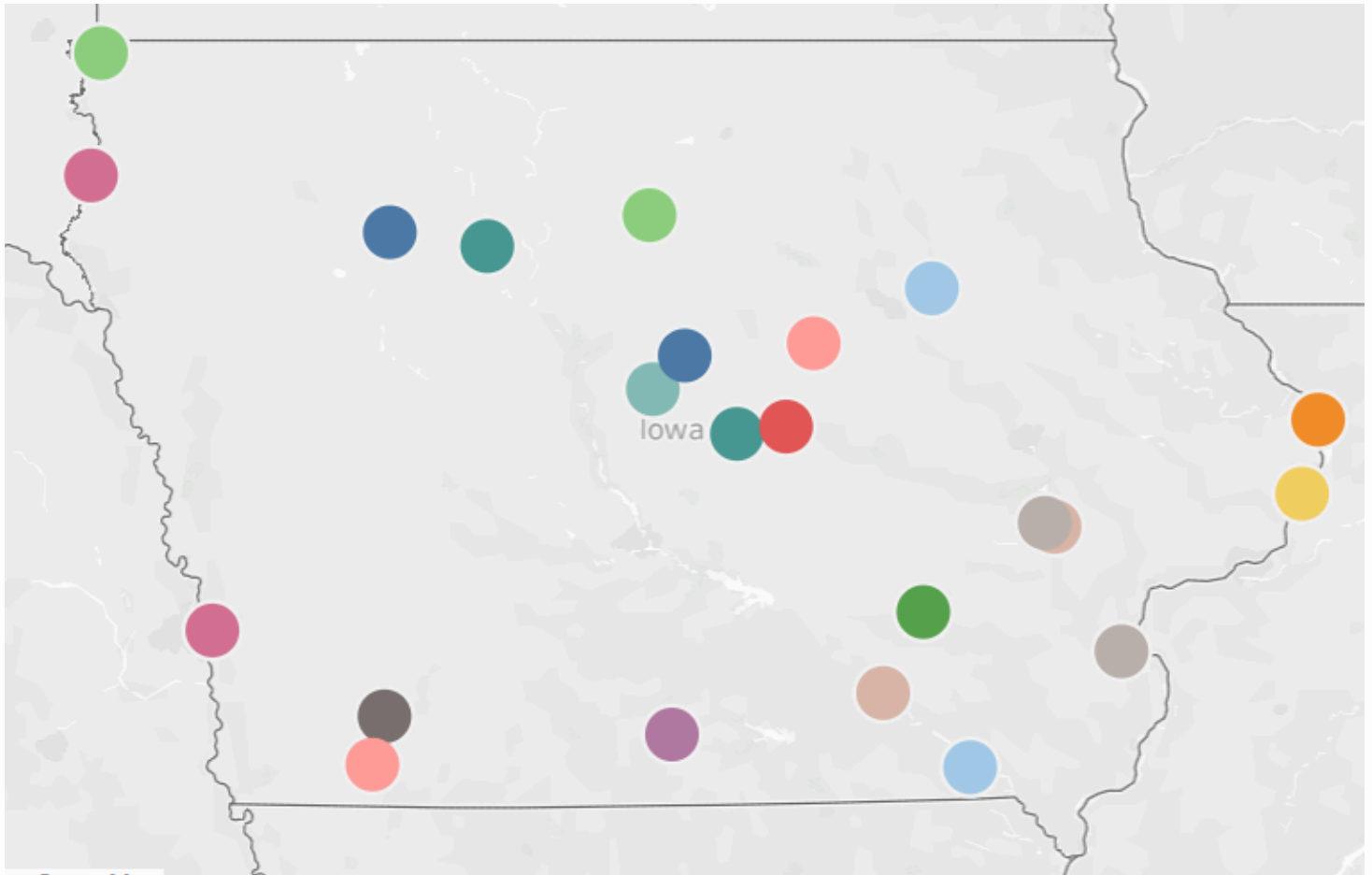
Average Peak Hourly
