Sew Fun

We had a full-class of adult sewers during this month's Ready, Set, Sew! event. What started out last year as a class focused on teaching students the basics of sewing, has expanded into classes for adult learners.



Using machines from our Create Collection, and the expertise of two library staff and one volunteer, all participants learned the basics of using a sewing machine. Though images of robots, computers and digital devices come to mind when we use terms like STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) sewing is very much a STEM-aligned activity. From designing to measuring, our sewing classes are empowering folks of all ages to connect with fellow citizens, learn new skills, and imagine new designs that they can make all from the comfort of their home library.

Mural Call for Art

In partnership with the Art Center of Burlington, the Burlington Community School District Art Department, and TICOS (Teens Inspiring Change, Optimism, & Service) the Burlington Public Library sent out a call for teen artists to help design and install a mural in the teen area of the library.

The library's teen advisory board, TICOS, will be helping to shape the future of our teen area, and have requested that artists submit designs of a Burlington landscape done in Manga style.

Submissions are due in December, and a final design will be selected in early 2025.
