Democracy in Dialogue

The Burlington Public Library's teen advisory group, TICOS (Teens Inspiring Changes, Optimism, and Service) has been selected to participate in the Democracy in Dialogue project sponsored by the Smithsonian. As the world's largest museum, education, and research complex, the Smithsonian Institute is helping to engage young people by asking, 'how has your community played a role in 250 years of the American experiment?' through the Democracy in Dialogue virtual exchange project. In 2026 the United States will celebrate its 250th birthday, and this project encourages students from all walks to life to engage in discovery, dialogue, and reflection by exploring the complexities in our nation's history. From the significant role that Burlington played with the Sauk and Meskwaki people to being the territorial capital and hosting the first Free Public Library West of the Mississippi, we have a rich history to lean on for our teens to explore. The unique cultural storytelling component of this project will be carried out with our teen mural installation in the teen area of the library. This will be the library's first permanent mural and will feature greater Burlington's story along with notable people from the area.

Pop-Up Concert

In partnership with The Capitol Theater and the University of Iowa Arts Share Program, we were able to host a free concert with the wildly talented Dunn Graduate String Quartet on May 20th.



The Mystery is Afoot!

The Burlington Public Library hosts 3 continuous book clubs, featuring titles from across genres and publication dates: Beyond the Book Club, Mystery Book Club, and Spicy Book Club. This month the Mystery Book Club aligned their title with the Player's Workshop spring production, Agatha Christie's Murder on the Orient Express. What made this title stand out was that the library's own Kaitlynn Broeg starred in Player's Workshop production of the play! Kaitlynn did a fabulous job, and readers were encouraged to both see the play and read the book for the May book club meeting.



Astronomy Club hosts Dr. Green

Several area clubs and service groups use the Burlington Public Library as their host location, including the Southeastern Iowa Astronomy Club. The John H. Witte Jr. Observatory housed at Big Hollow is a topnotch complex operated by the Astronomy Club, in addition to public lectures with space-minded folks. This month the club hosted a virtual lecture with famed physicist Dr. James L Green. A Burlington native who went on to make history with NASA and the National Space Science Data Center. Set up with our new Genealogy Room tech equipment, this program is an excellent example of our space reorganization paying off.

Over the Stacks

On May 30th the Burlington Public Library was highlighted in the unveiling of the newest exhibit at the Des Moines County Heritage Center Museum - Over the Stacks. For several months the library has worked with the museum to piece together the history of the Burlington Public Library while the museum staff refurbished the stacks that stand at the library's original stand-alone building at 501 N Court St.

Library Director, Brittany Jacobs, gave a speech on the impact of the city passing Ordinance 21 in May of 1885, and how that set the tone for the library to go on to be the important historical icon that it is today.
